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#### **Original Program Legislation**

"The conferees continue to be concerned about the health care needs of those in the Mississippi River Delta region. The conferees ...will provide \$6.8 million to continue HRSA's ongoing initiative which is providing funding and technical assistance to help underserved rural communities identify and better address their health care needs and to help small rural hospitals improve their financial and operational performance."

### Purpose of the DSRDN Program

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To improve the health of people living in rural Delta areas by:

- » Improving systems of health care in rural areas in the Delta
- » Strengthening rural Delta State community organizations' ability to develop and implement projects to address local health care needs





# Why Evaluate?



- How do you know if you're accomplishing program goals?
- Even if you ARE accomplishing those goals, could you be doing it better?
- How do you communicate your accomplishments to funders, partners, communities, and intended recipients of program services?















### **Program Assessment**



- Driven by original intent of program
- Used specifically by Federal Programs to demonstrate why they should continue to be funded







### Federal Approach: Assess Program Impact



- Emphasis on demonstrating impact of the DSRDN program
- Addresses realities of "performance-based budgeting"
- Need "evidence" to support program impact
- We (ORHP and you) can define what we believe constitutes "evidence"
